



. . Along the Way

Our new president has defined four crises we face as a nation; Covid, the economy, racial inequities, and climate change. But there is another over arching crisis that must be addressed, sinfulness. As the old Baltimore Catechism used to ask, "Why did God make you?" the pithy answer was "God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this world and to be happy with Him in the next." The way we serve Him is to do His will. When we don't try our best to do His will it is called sin.

When He created the universe, our Father set it in motion. All of our scientific learnings come from what engineers call "reverse engineering". That is the process of taking something that already exists and trying to understand how it works. Science is only learning from God's creation itself, how, it operates.

I often think of creation as building an automobile. The manufacturer has a plan for how it is to operate and puts that plan in the owners' manual that comes with the car. Putting sugar in the gas tank Is "sin". That act disrupts the plan and leads to the destruction of the vehicle's mechanical power source.

The bible and the teachings of the church are our "owners' manual". We knights are charged to help ourselves and others to follow the instructions in order that creation may operate within the Manufacturer's parameters.

If we can make any progress at all in this task, it will positively affect all the crises that we face.

Florida State 2021 Charity Raffle
