

Robert George Eyers went to the Risen Lord on Monday, October 3, 2022, in Venice, FL. Born in Oshkosh, WI to George and Helen (Faust) Eyers, he was a man who loved God and put that love into action every day.

Bob was deeply devoted to his wife Barbara (Blodgett), with whom he celebrated fifty-nine years of marriage. Together they were a shining example of love and faith to their four children, sixteen grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

Bob graduated from St. Lawrence Seminary in Mt. Calvary, WI and remained active in the Catholic Church all his life; through music ministry, parish council, teaching, small church community, Knights of Columbus and monetary support. He finished his Actuarial career with KPMG Peat Marwick and Rector & Assoc.

Hoping to continue his legacy are his children Cynthia (Michael) Williams of Delaware, OH, Christopher (Amy) Eyers of Cincinnati, OH, Andrew (Karen) Eyers of Mequon, WI, and Daniel (Diana) Eyers of Marysville, OH.



A Tribute from Bob Rueger:

Brother Bob Eyers Upon learning of Bob's death memories of the limited relationship I had with Bob came to mind. One could always find Bob center front, right side at OLOL attending daily Mass. One could also find Bob availing himself on a regular basis of the many graces available on Saturday afternoon before Mass at the Sacrament of Reconciliation. For many years Bob diligently maintained our KofC prayer listing and at our meetings, he read the names of all that had requested prayers. Bob was always present for the 5th weekend of the month for leading us in the Rosary and, in fact, did the opening prayers and the 1st decade in our last 5th week Rosary. Bob had developed a practice of calling me the day prior to remind me he would be there. During COVID time, Bob would lead saying the Rosary after Monday morning Mass. One Monday, his car was in for repairs so he had no transportation. A neighbor overheard our conversation and she assured both of us that Bob would be there for the Monday Rosary. In his days of good health, Bob would also be at planned parenthood in Sarasota, 2nd Tues., praying the Rosary for the unborn. I would be amiss if I failed to mention the very significant monetary contributions Bob Eyers made to Council 9924 over the years. In recent years, due to Bob's failing health and his elevated COVID risk, he was not able to attend our monthly meetings. Bob Eyers was a "KNIGHT'S Knight" and he will be missed.

All Souls Day November 2nd



All Souls' Day, also known as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the Day of the Dead, is a day of prayer and remembrance for the faithful departed, which is observed by Roman Catholics and other Christian denominations annually on November 2nd.

According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go.

Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:26 and 12:32. "Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... Thus, made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin."
