

Message from One Blood Representative

Thank you for your dedication and commitment to supporting blood drives at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, in addition to being a lifesaving blood donor. While during season, our hospital partners need more blood than out of season, the off season is more challenging as donations drop making it difficult to collect all the blood that hospitals need for their patients. This May is proving to be exceptionally challenging, with collections beginning to drop in April. It's been an unusual time for us, compounded by the hurricane and the pandemic ending, likely with many other factors impacting donations.

We are pleased to share with you that the recent blood drive resulted in **14** units of blood. Remember, each donation can save up to three lives, so that means **42** patients could benefit from the lifesaving efforts of blood donors from your organization. We encourage you to share the drive results with the rest of your Knights, as well as OLOL Parish, and please pass along our gratitude.

Every two seconds, someone needs blood. The blood donated at your blood drive will likely be transfused into a patient within 48 to 72 hours. The turnaround is that fast and is that constant.

Our next scheduled blood drive is Sunday, September 10th

In September, we offer donors a \$20 e-gift card and a OneBlood Cancer Awareness T-Shirt (subject to change).

Pro-Life Update



The Depopulation Bomb – Ray Ross

The most dangerous existential risk to mankind today is depopulation. There are few voices making us aware of the issue. Elon Musk in numerous appearances along with online tweets has warned that we're on a steep depopulation trend that is heading to a **sudden and irreversible population collapse.** This, he says, is a far greater danger to civilization than global warming. By the time those 21 and under wake up and see what is happening, they're going to be stuck in the 'birth gap trap." They'll be called on to start having larger families while needing to support a huge number of retirees expecting retirement benefits. As dedicated pro-life/pro-family supporters, we need to be keenly aware of this issue.

Abortion, of course, has played a huge role in the U.S. population decline with over 63 million babies aborted in the U.S. since *Roe v. Wade*. Despite our struggle against abortion, most of us are unaware of the stealth threat of depopulation. In their book,

Empty Planet: The Shock of Global Population Decline, Dr. Darrell Bricker and John Ibbitson describe the "fertility trap." In order for a country to sustain its population, women must average 2.1 children. In 2020, the U.S. fertility rate was 1.7 down from 3.7 in 1960. Europe's rate is 1.5, Japan's is 1.3. China has recently increased the number of children a family can have from 1 to 3, but their birth rate has only increased slightly. China's population is expected to decline by half over the next 25 years. While we thought Japan was going

to be first to face population collapse, South Korea, Taiwan and Singapore have birth rates of 0.8.

Our culture focuses on self-love, career fulfillment, and the risks of long-term commitment. Transgenderism is pushed by the media, corporations, the government and even our schools. Some are foregoing having a family because they're worried about climate change, or nuclear war. Couples today aren't having children because "they don't want to."

In so many ways our culture pushes an anti-family message.

In early May Harrison Butner, star place kicker for the Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, gave the commencement speech at Georgia Tech, his alma mater. In the speech, he told the 2023 graduating class that the best advice that he could give them "was to get married and start a family" - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=IM6PD5ydXec. Marriage and family, he says, give purpose to our lives and make us better people. "I don't care if you have a successful career...In the end, no matter how much money you attain, none of it will matter if you are alone and devoid of purpose."

God created Adam and Adam found himself alone. Then God created Eve so that they could love and be loved. God's plan for us is for us to love and, in giving love and being loved, to be fulfilled. His plan for us is to be "fruitful and multiply."

Not long ago, my oldest grandson was asked what he wanted to be when he grew up.

His response was "I want to be a dad." Music to my ears.

The Month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

The Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Friday following the second Sunday after Pentecost.

In addition to the liturgical celebration, many devotional exercises are connected with the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Of all devotions, devotion to the Sacred Heart was, and remains, one of the most widespread and popular in the Church.

Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term "Sacred Heart of Jesus" denotes the entire mystery of Christ, the totality of his being, and his person considered in its most intimate essential: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principal of the salvation and sanctification of mankind.

The "Sacred Heart" is Christ, the Word Incarnate, Savior, intrinsically containing, in the Spirit, an infinite divine-human love for the Father and for his brothers.
