



Your gift supports single mothers and their children who would otherwise be homeless. Mothers joining the program must attend life skills, parenting, self-esteem, nutrition, and financial literacy classes. They must also agree to accept communal responsibilities and genuinely want to move on to independence. As a result of your contribution, we can continue to be a beacon of light and hope that better days are ahead.

One recent success story that comes to mind is a mother of a two-week-old infant that was suddenly forced into poverty by the abandonment of the baby's father. On the verge of living in a car and considering giving her newborn up for adoption, she found us, and we were able to offer help quickly. She entered Our Mother's House program and was provided with food and shelter; she learned financial responsibility and the power of education. During the 18 months that she resided at Our Mother's House, she finished her college degree, was offered a position with a major pharmaceutical company overseeing clinical trials, and can now provide for herself. She said it best: "Now I have a career, not just a job; it's like a dream come true."

The success of our programs is only possible with your support. Because of you and your generosity, lives are changed forever, and together, we can continue to provide *help, create hope, and serve all*.

Knights of Columbus 9924 Backpack Program Update





Since The Knights of Columbus from Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Venice was approached by AFFB 15 years ago to get involved with the Backpack Program, Jim Palermo was the KoC Chairman. The Council handled Oak Park at the Middle School and Taylor Ranch School. Oak Park no longer exists. It has been a very meaningful 16 years knowing and seeing the good we have done for the kids and families in this area. Since Covid the involvement of the Knights has been drastically reduced. Also, as more and more donors have turned to QCD's from their IRA's we felt it appropriate to alert all donors and all Knights to send donations directly to AFFB, a 501c3 charity. There is no need for the knights to be the middleman since we turned over all donated backpack money to AFFB anyway. We ask that in the future you mark your donations to AFB and in the subject line that you note FOR Benefit of the Knights of Columbus.

Over the past 2 years we have been blessed with a few significant donations that have allowed us to support 100 students at Taylor Ranch School with weekend lunch bags as well as providing 75 Turkey Dinners for their families at Thanksgiving and 75 Ham Dinners for Christmas. But as with all programs the needs in our communities continue to grow and the need for more volunteers and donations along with it. Volunteering can be done in one of two ways:

- 1. Warehouse Packing of Back Packs and Case goods. Sessions last 2-3 hours have both morning and afternoon shifts. AFB is located in Sarasota off Fruitville Road.
- 2. Mobile Food Pantries. These are held at multiple locations and include about 6 to 8 locations around Venice. You help setup and work a drive thru distribution of a variety of food products to prequalified families. In any given shift a locations will serve 100-200 families.

So How do we volunteer. Its easy. Once you are registered (you can follow the link below) you will receive an email once a month listing available/shifts that you can sign up for. Teams normally have 12-15 volunteers and wife's are highly encouraged. Volunteer opportunities include sorting and packing food, distributing at pantries, participating in our nutrition education and cooking classes, helping in our offices, lending a hand at events and more!

Prolife Report: The Sound of Freedom

As Knights we are called to do all we can to protect the born as well as the unborn.

A few days ago, my wife and I went to see "Sound of Freedom," the movie currently number one on box office charts. The movie is based on the work of Tim Ballard, initially a Homeland Security Investigative agent. The movie stars Jim Caviezel who plays the role of Tim Ballard. You may remember Caviezel as Jesus in Mel Gibson's "The Passion of Christ."

The movie revolves around the kidnapping of a brother and sister, Miguel and Rocio who are then sold into the sex trafficking trade. Ballard gets involved when a man by the name of Earl Buchanan is arrested at a U.S. Port of Entry as he attempts to smuggle Miguel into the United States. In the movie Ballard takes Miguel out for a hamburger and the boy pleads with Ballard to find and rescue his sister.

These children are only two of hundreds of children that Tim Ballard has rescued since 2002. Ballard started his career in the CIA and then moved over to Homeland Security once Homeland Security was formed after 911. He was moved to the Mexican border where he first focused on tracking terrorists and then was asked to join the Investigative Unit of

Homeland Security focused on child trafficking.

In 2006 a law was passed that allowed Homeland Security agents to go into foreign countries to investigate child trafficking activities as long as the case involved a U.S. citizen. In the case of the young girl that Ballard was attempting to find, he discovers that a U.S.

citizen is not involved and he has a very difficult decision to make about whether to quit Homeland Security three months before he was eligible for retirement or continue to track

the criminals and try to rescue the girl.

Ballard is married with six kids at the time (now nine children) and, if he quits, the family could lose their home. His wife plays a crucial role in his decision. She tells him that he must continue to try and rescue the girl and that her own soul is at stake. She does not want to stand before God at her judgment and tell God that she had her husband make the comfortable choice.

After he left Homeland Security, Ballard set up OUR, Operation Underground Railroad. His work involved going underground, setting up sting operations, and dealing with some of the darkest, most evil people alive. In the course of his work, he is traumatized by the evil he sees and experiences. I

Human trafficking is now a \$150B per annum business and rivals the size of drug trafficking. There are more people enslaved now globally than at any time in human history. Six million children are being forced into sex slavery, labor slavery or organ harvesting every year and the U.S. is the largest consumer of the trade (this includes massive consumption of child pornography). There are 85,000+ unaccompanied children who have shown up at the border in the last two years. These children come in without their sponsors being vetted and many then disappear.

Ballard today continues his rescue work. I was surprised to find that a key funder of his work is Glenn Beck.

The movie was actually made five years ago but has been roadblocked in every way imaginable.

I highly recommend the movie. It is a top-notch drama and does not have graphic scenes that might turn you away.

Immaculate Heart of Mary

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century, Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

This devotion has received new emphasis in the 20th century from the visions given to Lucia Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the

Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions, Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men.

Our Lady mentioned her Immaculate Heart in her second apparition in June. She told Lucia she would stay on the earth after her cousins went to heaven since Jesus wishes you to make me known and loved on earth. He wishes also for you to establish devotion in the world to my Immaculate Heart.

Our Blessed Mother also told her, I will be with you always, and my Immaculate Heart will be your comfort and the way which will lead you to God.

On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. The world was in turmoil in the 1940s and in 1942 he responded to the requests of Our Lady of Fatima and consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on October 31, 1942.
