Dear Knights,

We wanted to offer our sincerest thanks for helping make our Christmas an unforgettable one for our clients at Pregnancy Solutions.

In our four centers we blessed 236 client children. We gave out a wide variety of toys, from giant stuffed teddy bears to legos to baby walkers to neon rope lighting for teens. Many parents chose toys to give to their children personally, while others brought their kids in to choose a present from under the tree. We received many gracious thank you's, and clients were overwhelmed by the extravagant generosity displayed. We have been asked by clients to pass on their gratitude to the donors, as they expressed what a difference this has made for their families.

Below is a small sample of the specific client situations that made receiving presents an extra blessing:

- -Recently homeless family living in a camper
- -Single mom with recent health issues, struggling to make rent
- -Single mom, whose father of baby is in prison so she has no support
- -out of work family
- -young couple with baby trying to get their own place, but car broke down recently
- -single mom of twins with little support
- -family living in charity housing
- -family with two kids still living in an RV since the hurricane
- -Single mom who often goes hungry and could not afford presents

We have multiple clients who are just starting out, struggling with the housing market and the cost of living in general, with baby expenses making their financial situation challenging. We have several clients with recent health issues who are now struggling to work. A large number of our clients have little to no support system when first joining our program. Overall, our clients with significant needs were grateful for the blessing of being able to give their children presents this year.

In addition, we were able to bless four families that were in the greatest amount of need from each of our centers and adopt their family in a greater way for Christmas with more specific needs and wish list items.

Knights of Columbus 9924 Backpack Program Update



Since The Knights of Columbus from Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in Venice was approached by AFFB 15 years ago to get involved with the Backpack Program, Jim Palermo was the KofC Chairman. The Council handled Oak Park at the Middle School and Taylor Ranch School. Oak Park no longer exists. It has been a very meaningful 16 years knowing and seeing the good we have done for the kids and families in this area. Since Covid the involvement of the Knights has been drastically reduced. Also, as more and more donors have turned to QCD's from their IRA's we felt it appropriate to alert all donors and all Knights to send donations directly to AFFB, a 501c3 charity. There is no need for the knights to be the middleman since we turned over all donated backpack money to AFFB anyway. We ask that in the future you mark your donations to AFB and in the subject line that you note FOR Benefit of the Knights of Columbus.

Over the past 2 years we have been blessed with a few significant donations that have allowed us to support 100 students at Taylor Ranch School with weekend lunch bags as well as providing 75 Turkey Dinners for their families at Thanksgiving and 75 Ham Dinners for Christmas. But as with all programs the needs in our communities continue to grow and the need for more volunteers and donations along with it. Volunteering can be done in one of two ways:

- 1. Warehouse Packing of Back Packs and Case goods. Sessions last 2-3 hours have both morning and afternoon shifts. AFB is located in Sarasota off Fruitville Road.
- 2. Mobile Food Pantries. These are held at multiple locations and include about 6 to 8 locations around Venice. You help setup and work a drive thru distribution of a variety of food products to prequalified families. In any given shift a locations will serve 100-200 families.

So How do we volunteer. Its easy. Once you are registered (you can follow the link below) you will receive an email once a month listing available/shifts that you can sign up for. Teams normally have 12-15 volunteers and wife's are highly encouraged. Volunteer opportunities include sorting and packing food, distributing at pantries, participating in our nutrition education and cooking classes, helping in our offices, lending a hand at events and more!

The Miracle of Motherhood!

"When pregnant, the cells of the baby migrate into the mother's bloodstream and then circle back into the baby, and it's called "fetal-maternal micro chimerism".

For 41 weeks, the cells circulate and merge backwards and forwards, and after the baby is born, many of these cells stay in the mother's body, leaving a permanent imprint in the mother's tissues, bones, brain, and skin, and often stay there for decades. Every single child a mother has afterwards will also leave a similar imprint on her body. Even if a pregnancy doesn't go to full term or if you have an abortion these cells still migrate into your bloodstream.

The baby helps repair the mother, while the mother builds the baby. This is often why certain illnesses vanish while pregnant. Research has shown that if a mother's heart is injured, fetal cells will rush to the site of the injury and change into different types of cells that specialize in mending the heart.

It's incredible how mothers' bodies protect the baby at all costs, and the baby protects and rebuilds the mother back. Think about crazy cravings for a moment; what was the mother deficient in, that the baby made them crave?

Studies have also shown cells from a fetus in a mother's brain even 18 years after she gave birth. If you're a mom, you know how you can intuitively feel your child even when they are not there ...

Well, now there is scientific proof that moms carry those children for years and years even after they have given birth to them.

The month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus, which is celebrated on January 3. The first ten days of January fall during the liturgical season known as Christmas which is represented by the liturgical color white, the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored).
